Expect Respect (Year 10, Section 3, pages 1-10) Behaviours – OK or Not?

REaDAPT! (Module 4) Abuse between parents and other adult carers.

Dating relationships – communication, respect, enjoyment etc.; identify and address signs of abusive relationships; Enable students to recognise and challenge the culturally expected behaviour of different genders in a relationship.

Expect Respect (Year 11, section 3, pages 1-8) Domestic Abuse — It's Criminal — To facilitate the students' learning experience, it is suggested that they are made aware that domestic violence is criminal without going through this section's exercises (since these are based on UK law, and law can be amended from time to time).

REaDAPT! (Module 5) Leaving, staying, coping and surviving.

REaDAPT! (Module 6) What happens if it happens to me?

These indicated resources can be used when addressing the following topics in the form 5 syllabus:

How our values affect our decisions; Understand how relationships can affect emotions and life-stress, death, break-up, separation, birth, coping strategies; avoid risky online relationships; Exploring issues of responsibility in sexual relationships - risks, decisions, responsibilities, values; Sexual orientation.
